Arthritis

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Arthritis

- Osteoarthritis (OA)
- Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA)
 - Subcategory of Inflammatory Polyarthritis
 - Others Include: Rheumatic Fever, Ankylosing Spondylitis,
 Systemic Rheumatic Diseases

Evaluation

- Arthritis in three joint areas (symmetric & includes hands) RA
- Rheumatoid nodules RA
- Serum rheumatoid factors (anti-CCP, RF, ESR, C-reactive protein) RA
- Evaluation of synovial fluid (elevated white count) OA
- Radiographic study (osteophytes bone spurs) OA

Arthritis

	Rheumatoid Arthritis	Osteoarthritis
Joints	Warm, Soft & Tender	Hard and Bony
Stiffness	Worse after Resting	Worse after Effort

Common Behavioral Symptoms Caused or Exacerbated by Arthritis

- Activity Inhibition
 - Pain Avoidance
- Depressed Mood

Medical Management

OA

- Acetaminophen if no inflammation
- Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) if inflammation
- Intraarticular glucocorticoid injection if the above gives inadequate relief

RA

- Anti-inflammatory drugs
- Disease-modifying antirheumatic drugs (DMARDs)
- Analgesics

Most Common Goals

- Increased Physical Activity (with Pacing RA)
 - Independently Improves Arthritis Symptoms
 - Reduce BMI (If Appropriate) Add Dietary Change
- Stress Reduction CBT and Mindfulness
- Improved Mood -> Reduction in Dysphoria (or Depression) & Anxiety
- Improved Sleep
- Improved Adherence



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
